“Everyday Life in the Past” Suggested Itinerary

There are many things to see at Historic Deerfield. We suggest the following experiences...

WALKING TOURS:

- A Daily Walking Tour of the village and town common departs at 10:30 a.m. The tour sets the stage for understanding the 18th-century town of Deerfield. *Weather permitting.*

OR

- Printed Walking Tour Brochures about the English Settlement, the Pocumtuck Homeland, and the Old Burying Ground explain daily lives of early English settlers, and the Pocumtuck people who preceded the English. Walking tour brochures are available for purchase.

SELF GUIDED SPACES you can visit on your own, at your own pace:

- The Sheldon House shows daily life for an average farming family from 1780 to 1810. Open daily 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.
- The Cooks’ Garden interprets the herbs and vegetables that would have been grown in an 18th-century kitchen garden. Open daily 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.
- The Apprentice’s Workshop at Dwight House shows how goods were made by hand. Includes hands-on learning. Open daily 12-4 p.m.

GUIDED HOUSE TOURS available on the hour from 10 a.m.-4 p.m.:

- The Wells-Thorn House takes visitors through 125 years of Deerfield history in seven rooms, explaining how the town changed from 1725 to 1850. *Visitors should arrive five minutes before the start of hourly tours. Tours last approximately 35 minutes.*
- The Hinsdale and Anna Williams House focuses on the Williams family, and their life in the grand federal mansion they extensively renovated in 1816. *Visitors should arrive five minutes before the start of hourly tours. Tours last approximately 35 minutes.*

Museum Store Hours: open 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. daily

Champney’s Tavern at the Deerfield Inn Hours: open 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. for beverages and snacks; lunch served 12-2:30 p.m.
