Consideration what Sum Shall be allowed out of the Estate of Captn John Catlin Decd to Joseph Catlin to make his part of the house as good as that which belongeth to Seth Catlin have determined the Sum to be Ten pounds eighteen shillings & four pence

Have also taken into consideration whether there shall be any Allowance made out of Said Estate to the Said Joseph Catlin for what he has done upon the Estate of Aforesaid more than what the Said Seth has done on Said Estate Since he come to the age of Twenty one years have determined that there is no consideration to be made to the Said Joseph
