LOCATION:

Just off I91, Exit 24N or 25S in Deerfield, Massachusetts. Approximately 2 hours west of Boston, 3 ½ hours north of New York City, 1 ½ hours east of Albany, New York, and 5 hours south of Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

2010 Season: museum houses and Flynt Center of Early New England Life open daily April 17–November 28, 2010, 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (except Thanksgiving Day November 25.) Winter Hours in effect November 29, 2010–April 15, 2011: Exhibitions and Galleries at the Flynt Center of Early New England Life open weekends 9:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m. (museum houses closed).

MUSEUMS:

11 museum houses dating from c1720 to 1850 display more than 25,000 objects made or used in America from 1600-1900. Highlights of the collection include American furniture with special emphasis on the Connecticut River Valley; English and Chinese ceramics; American and English silver – including work by Paul Revere; and American and English textiles. The Flynt Center of Early New England Life offers exhibitions including: **“Celebrating the Fiber Arts: The Helen Geier Flynt Textile Gallery”** permanent with changing elements; **“Engraved Powder Horns from the French and Indian War and the American Revolution: The William H. Guthman Collection”** permanent; **“Into the Woods: Crafting Early American Furniture,”** long-term; and **“Dinner is Served!: Dining and the Decorative Arts”** open August 21, 2010 through February 27, 2011..

The Memorial Libraries include the 21,000 volumes of the Henry N. Flynt Library of Historic Deerfield, as well as the books and manuscripts of the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association Library. The Memorial Libraries offer an extensive collection of materials relating to the history and material culture of Deerfield and the Connecticut River Valley. Students, scholars, and the general public are welcome. Open Tuesday through Friday, 9 a.m.–12 p.m., and 1–5 p.m. year round.
