Historic Deerfield Announces Exciting Lineup of Events for All Ages and Interests

The Unnamed Figures exhibition, hearth cooking and historic trade demonstrations, a Juneteenth musical event, kids' crafts, nature walks—and more—mark the start of an exciting season in the historic village on May 1st.

(Deerfield, MA) — <u>Historic Deerfield</u> is thrilled to unveil a diverse and engaging roster of upcoming events, offering something for everyone this season. Whether you're a history or art lover, a nature enthusiast, or simply looking for a fun family outing, Historic Deerfield has an event that will spark your curiosity and ignite your imagination.

The season kicks off on May 1, when the museum reopens its doors to the public and begins its exhibition of <u>Unnamed Figures: Black Presence and Absence in the Early American North</u>. Through 97 remarkable works including paintings, needlework, ceramics, and photographs, the exhibition invites visitors to focus on figures who appear in—or are omitted from—early American images and will challenge conventional narratives that have minimized early Black histories in the North. The exhibition, originally shown at the <u>American Folk Art Museum</u> in New York City, will be on view at Historic Deerfield's Flynt Center of Early New England Life from May 1 to August 4, 2024.

To mark the start of the new exhibition—and a new season—**Historic Deerfield will hold an** <u>Opening Celebration</u> on Saturday, May 4th at Hall Tavern, the Flynt Center, and other locations along the street. The day will feature demonstrations of printing, powderhorn carving, tours, hearth cooking, a craft activity, and more!

On May 12 (Mothers Day!) and June 9 at 10 a.m., a guided <u>Natural History Walk</u> around Old Deerfield will take place. The season continues with <u>Wooly Wonders – Heritage Breed Sheep</u> <u>Weekend</u> on May 18-19. Visitors can see rare, historic and adorable heritage breed sheep, learn about textiles, and wool-processing in New England, do craft activities, play games, and watch a demonstration of sheepdog herding! On June 20th at 7 p.m., Historic Deerfield will host <u>Music</u> <u>for Juneteenth</u> at the Deerfield Community Center.
