



#### Williams House

Built in 1730 and remodeled 1817, household of prosperous village residents.



# Silver & Metalware

Collection
c. 1814, a gallery of antique silver & metalware.



#### Allen House

1734, home of Henry and Helen Flynt, founders of Historic Deerfield. Furnished with their collection of American decorative arts.



**Stebbins House** 1799, restoration in progress. Building archaeology exhibit.



## Cooks' Garden

A traditional herb garden with many heirloom plants.



#### Frary House

c. 1760, Colonial Revival home of preservationist Charlotte Alice Baker, restored in the 1890s, with New England antiques, Arts and Crafts needlework, ironware, and basketry.

#### **Barnard Tavern**

Built in 1795, the Tavern was at the center of village life at the end of the 18th century.



### Memorial Libraries

Open Tuesday-Friday and first Saturdays, 9 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-5 p.m., to visitors who have an interest in early New England life, local history, and decorative arts.



#### Wells-Thorn House

1747, interior furnishings illustrate change through time, 1725 to 1850. Home of Lucy Terry Prince, first known African-American poet.
